



George Smith, a local farmer and illicit distiller, founded The Glenlivet Distillery in 1824 thereby legitimising the renowned illicit whisky from the area.

Glenlivet became a byword for the finest whisky money could buy and as a result other Speyside distillers took to branding the name on their casks.

21 Year Old.

A whisky to enjoy anywhere, at any time, because it is easy to appreciate and share. With a renowned smoothness and a honeyed, fruity taste.

Colour: Amber with sparkling copper shades.

Nose: Opulent, mature. Sherry influence. An intricate array of fruit and wood. Christmas cake-like, sultanas, Maraschino cherry, thick-cut marmalade. Oak panels in an old church, a cedary touch. Balsamic spices, Cubèbe pepper. A hint of eucalyptus, tropical hardwood. Oak soon gives way to malty notes. Fruit and fibre cereal bowl, toasted granary bread. Citrusy freshness, orange and kumquat peel. Some cakey notes, a reminder of Grand Marnier soufflé.

Taste: Unctuous. Mouth-coating, almost syrupy. Full-bodied. Sultana cake, ginger biscuits. Oak holds the reins back, releasing a drying spiciness. Cinnamon and ginger, a touch of hot paprika. Walnut and raisins, dark chocolate.

Finish: Everlasting, warming. Nutty. Toasted hazelnuts. A full layer of liquorice.



25 Year Old.

The oldest permanent release within The Glenlivet range.

An authoritative and supremely premium expression of both packaging and product.

A 1980 vintage selection which has been “finished” in first fill sherry butts, giving a nutty spiciness to the multi-layered flavour of the spirit and enriches its colour.

Each individually numbered bottle is presented in a solid wooden box, reinforced by limestone and sealed by a removable brushed ingot. The use of a wax seal on the bottle reinforces the precious nature of the contents within.

A certificate of quality gives details of the story of the craftsmanship which goes into the whisky, displaying the signatures of those responsible for ensuring the required standard has been met at the four key stages of the production process and the accompanying booklet which tells the product story.

Nose: Soft round fruity oakiness with hints of dried spices combined with subtle oloroso sherry aromas.

Palate: Intense raisin and fruity flavours finishing with a balanced dry oakiness.
